Wayne county's delegation to the Fremont Best Growers convention held last week some home pretty thoroughly satisfied that the business as usual to become one of the state's leading industries. The new process of reduction they believe is found to solve the question between the grower and manufacturer. It is the result of the necessity of plants of this kind to the communities where the beet is grown and thus cutting off the exorbitant transportation charges. A large manufacturer of Omaha declared that he had investigated the business very thoroughly and was fully satisfied that the same machinery identically except that used in the refining process could be utilized for the production of alcohol from corn thus keeping the plants running the entire year instead of three months as at present. If this is true, then we are just approaching the time when our beet can be successfully operated in all climates like our own where we can grow to perfection both the beets and corn. Factories of this kind are being erected by the hundreds and will become permanently permanent. When we can turn our raw material into a manufactured product, then we are on the highway to prosperity and not until then. Let not our best growers become discouraged and abandon the business because it was not so highly remunerative during the last season as they hoped. The cause here is not in the trouble between the factory and the grower any more than it is. The weather at the dipping time was against the proper maturity of the beets. It was never so before and may be so again. Grow beets, but don't grow them so largely. There is a great deal for the producer to be done along this line of work, and it is necessary to obtain reliable factory results. Go a little slow and learn the business.
