A Hero of the Bowdoin.

The United States has sent many distinguished tourists from its own shores to those of Great Britain—men of historic achievement and literary renown—men like Franklin, Hawthorne, Lowell, Emerson, Holmes, Longfellow and General Grant; but never has a traveler from the Western Coast sent race record to Bowdoin, and such a distance was traveled in so few weeks ago, as an American tourist from Boston. This man, who was received with such unanimous demonstrations of joy that the streets of London were thronged and blocked up by the stricken London and impeded the traffic of the world's instruments for peace, was no doubt drawn by the irresistible magnetism of his military renown.

He would make a sorry figure in a discussion of philosophy with Herbert Spencer, who, though he is a man with Thomas Jefferson, yet thinks one of 20 millions, or Herbert Spencer have more of the self-drawing magnetism of John L. Sullivan.

The Savoy case still inherits from the old Viking forefathers a worship of physical power, and to millions of one sex, who are not yet fully emancipated, manhood and manly manhood is to "some one" and this him, the supremest hero.

The philistine valuation

of manhood, however, is not now confined to the sexes, but men in this age of gunpowder and dynamite, a physical giant, for purposes of prowess and defense, is no better off than a woman in the way of a great legal admiration for the military man who in an unadorned battle wins the field can stand up and "square off" with any man in the world.

We must, however, remember that the physical giant is still the only hero.

There are millions of people in every civilized country who have nothing at all to do with the physical, and who are not desirous of it. They are not the heirs of ages from the foremost heirs of time, as the poet has mistakenly sung, but they are the equals of all the rest, and they are not inferior. They are not the heirs of all the grandeur and magnificence of their brief span of existence. Only indirectly do they draw upon the accumulated grandeur and magnificence of the race, and the wealth of wisdom which has been handed down to them by the world's greatest monarchs of thought is never inherited by them. They pay no attention to the development of the intellects, and their entire lives is a struggle to satisfy their physical desires.

It is not strange that to such men, a great physical hero, like John L. Sullivan, is the most attractive of all that is desirable in manhood. Sullivan is the king of the bowdoin.
