**DR. POTTER SEES GLADSTONE.**  
Here the Grand Old Man Looks Back and Acts in Church.

From Sioux City comes a revival of the spirit chestnut that the Union Pacific will extend the Norfolk line to Sioux City in the spring.

"Of vital importance to the political significance whatever," is the substance of the reply made by the visiting statesmen at Indianapolis.

In his forthcoming report Attorney General Evarts gets after the railroads with a sharp stick and recommends some very stringent legislation.

Riddleberger, of Virginia, introduced a resolution in the senate on Monday for the re-organization of the body for the purpose of removing fugals from the chair.

Sioux City has decided to go to the inauguration by a "Corn Palace" train and invite everybody in the northwest to take the train. The fare for the round-trip will be about thirty dollars.

Every town in southern Dakota is in the field for the capital of the new state, and nowhere outside of the garden of Eden are there localities with so many advantages, natural and otherwise, as the average Dakota town.

The Omaha ministers have received an urgent request to enlighten the people of that city, through the press, as to "What are we going to do in Heaven?" It would be much more appropriate for the Omahans to discuss the question, "What on earth are we going to do to get to Heaven?"

One of the settlers erected by the Des Moines River Land Co. has brought suit to recover the value of the improvements. It will be made a test case, and if successful, all the settlers will institute similar proceedings. The amount involved is estimated at half a million dollars.

The experiments already made in raising sorghum for sugar in Kansas have been so successful that factories will be established in different places in that state in the spring. If they prove to prove as profitable as expected it will only be a short time until the United States will furnish its own sugar.

The Omaha Republican is again in trouble on account of disagreement between the stockholders, and the matter has been placed in the hands of a receiver by order of court.

The paper has for years been a great disappointment to the republicans of the state. With the opportunity to become not only the leading republican paper, but the strongest and most influential journal of the state; it has signally failed to improve its splendid opportunity and has constantly occupied an inferior place in circulation and influence. It is to be hoped that out of its present troubles may come a beneficial change. The republicans of Nebraska are ready to give a good support to a party paper at Omaha just as soon as it deserves to be supported.

The introduction of a joint resolution by representatives, Butterworth, of Ohio, declaring in favor of the annexation of Canada, will cause a general discussion of the entire question in both countries and lead to a better understanding of the position of the Canadians on the question. There is a large party in Canada in favor of a union with the United States, but it remains to be seen whether it constitutes anything like a majority. Annexation might and probably would be a good thing for Canada, but that this country would gain anything by it is extremely doubtful. The United States has no need for more territory for its population.
