Dakota City Eagle—The Eagle learns that the recent election in Thurston county was about as rotten as the election in Dakota county last fall, so far as the Indian vote is concerned. He was closely watched for a week before election, he was promised and filled with bribes and was ordered by his great superior to do as he was requested. It is whispered that a consideration which consisted of two town lots in Pender and a sum of money that the Indians vote would be fixed by gentlemen of influence, but then, there are certain parties in Dakota county that make their living that way. In these days of enlightenment the new voters of Thurston county think that the noble Indian can be bought the same as bull beef.

There was music in their in Pender, the county seat of Thurston county, last Saturday. Several Indians were arrested for stealing cattle and were brought to town to receive treatment. They were bound over to the district court and as the town and county was without a calaboose or jail the sheriff knew not what to do with his charge. For lack of funds it is a question whether the commissioners will provide a jail. On Monday he brought two of the Indians to this place for safe keeping and they are now enjoying some of the luxuries of Hotel de Brasefeld. They give their names as Henry Harris and Dan King, and are well educated and nice appearing Indian boys.
