Food Prices.
 The present would seem to disprove the Malthus theory that increased population will not be supplied with bread. The price of day work will keep a man living longer than ever before in our history. It will buy him more bread than it ever has done since America was discovered. This result is a surprise to those who provide the bread, certainly, eaters need not except a continuance of the peculiar conditions. Everybody's prosperity is better assured at present than that of the who grows grain and meat. One day's work of an Eastern mechanic pays freight on all the food he eats for a year from the West, so says Atkinson. That less than two day's work buys the food in the West, is now currently written. Commodities from the South and East do not come that easy to us here. The fifty six pounds of sugar, and prices for farmers' produce. Coffee for a year will take over a week's work. The commodities go steadily up. There is a complaint that local retail dealers

have combinations that greatly enhance prices. We have not exact data, but if competition has ceased among them, co-operative stores are the only cure.
 Will farmers' products, wheat, corn, beef, butter, and the like, go still lower? Who can tell? The rush is not over to new lands, nor will it be till the last Indian reservation is open to settlement. The meat trusts are in their prime. We could endure lower rates better for farm products if all other commodities were correspondingly cheap. It is worth looking into whether intermediaries make things too dear. —Iowa Homestead.
