A terrible blizzard raged for eight days in New Mexico, beginning on the 1st, and twenty-six inches of snow fell on the level. Thousands upon thousands of cattle and sheep perished.

Secretary of state Lays, who was elected to congress to fill the vacancy caused by the death of Laird, has resigned. The governor has appointed B. F. Cowdrey, of Columbus, to the position.

It seems to have been an off year all around. The republican counties elected democratic county officials and the democratic counties returned the compliment by putting republicans to office.

What a single vote may do is curiously illustrated in Iowa this year. The democratic candidate for representative by elected by one majority, and his election makes the lower house of the Iowa legislature a tie.

The contest over the Tunnel project votes in Montana has been decided in favor of the democrats, giving the control of the legislature and sending two democratic senators from the new state to Washington.

The Iowa democrats, who have been watching the republicans toast their shins by the official fires for thirty-six years, are preparing to make governor-elect Boies' life a burden over the dozen or more offices he will control.

The democrats are making more noise over their "off year" victories than the republicans did over their substantial victory last year. Go ahead gentlemen. Have all the fun you can. The republicans will resume their proper place at the head of the column when there is something more than local issues involved.

The national W. C. T. U. eloped over considerably when it passed resolutions denouncing vice president Morton because the lesso of a hotel the vice president owns at Washington was reported as having a bar in connection. It turns out that the hotel has no bar, no places for one, and there is not the remotest intension of putting one in.

The latest political combination reported in Nebraska is one between Richards and Dorsey of Fremont and lieutenant governor Melickjohn. Richards is to be governor, Dorsey is to go back to congress and Melickjohn is to be attorney general. It's a nice scheme and will furnish the gentleman some amusement. The people will take a hand in the matter later.

There is no question but the election in Iowa turned on prohibition, and that the people of the state say emphatically by the result that they are not satisfied with prohibition as a method of dealing with the liquor question. The experience of Iowa will be a powerful factor in the fight in this state next year, and there is no reason to doubt that prohibition will be finally defeated.

That he should have got the number of votes he did against a good man as Mr. Dilts and Mr. Russell, regularly nominated by the republican and democratic parties, when he himself had practically no nomination whatever, so one doing any special work for him, and depending solely on the record he has made in the office the result is by no means unaccountable to Mr. Miller. In fact, that his administration of the office, without outside aid, should have made him a formidable competitor for the office is a fact of which Mr. Miller may justly be proud.

THE CATHOLIC CONGRESS.
 An Interesting Session at Baltimore—A Reception by the Maryland Legislature.
 Baltimore, Nov. 12.—The Catholic congress began its sessions. Delegates to the number of 1,200 assembled at solemn pontifical mass in the morning, celebrated by Archbishop Connors of New York. The sermon was preached by Archbishop Gros of Oregon. At the conclusion of the sermon, the delegates participated in the Conception Mass. The congress was called to order at 11:15 by William J. O'Connell of Chicago. Mr. O'Connell read a message from the pope. It reads:
 Having made known to the Holy Father our part of the Catholic congress, to be held in Baltimore, his Holiness bids me to say that he most affectionately imparts his blessing to all the members.
 (Signed) M. CARDINAL BAMPOLLE.
 Mr. O'Connell then welcomed the delegates of forty countries. His Excellency John Lee Carroll of Maryland was then elected chairman, and a long list of secretaries and vice-presidents appointed.
 When the congress re-assembled at 2 o'clock, the committee, with John Lee Carroll as chairman, was appointed. Mr. Carroll, President Harrison and invite him to the congress.
 The first topic to be read by John G. Shea of Elizabeth, N. J., on the subject of "The Holy Spirit" was written by Henry F. Brownson of Detroit on "The Action in the Church."
 The second topic was read by William F. Morris of Washington. He then spoke on "The Independence of the Holy See."
 His reception was tendered in the evening at the Concordia Opera house by the clergy and laity of Maryland to their visiting brethren. The pope was crowned to the doors with prelates, priests and people. The bishops, priests and delegates to the congress were welcomed by Charles B. Roberts of Westminster, extemporary general of this state.
 W. F. Morris of Washington spoke of the achievements of the Catholic triumph of heroic pioneers—Columbus, Carroll and Calver.
 Archbishop Elder, in behalf of the visiting clergy and delegates, responded to the address of welcome.
 An expose followed.
 LOAN, O., Nov. 12.—Some weeks ago the Boston Safe Deposit and Trust Company filed a suit in the federal court, common pleas court, to rescind a mortgage securing the bonds of the Ohio Western Coal and Iron company whose recent failure is still so severely felt throughout the valley. The answer and cross petition of D. Lee was answered by the company, Messrs. Ewing and Beutard of New York and Fairbanks Smith of Columbus and his bid fair to make quite a sensation and to expose to the public curiosity some of the interesting history of the various coal operations.

A Custom House Clerk Sues.
BALTIMORE, Nov. 12.—John F. Buckheimer, son of Fritz Buckheimer, the political "boss" of the second ward, committed suicide by shooting himself at his home. He was 34 years old, and employed as a clerk in the custom house. No reason is known for the act.
