A RAILROAD DANGER.

Cars Crash Through a Trestle Near Indianapolis.

LOADING FORTY FEET BELOW.

The Week Takes Five and Seven Trains Crossed the Trestle, Many Other Cars Were Injured.

INDIANAPOLIS, Jan. 28.—The fatal crash of the Air Line division of the Louisville, New Albany and Chicago railway was wrecked at the trestle over Wilson's creek, sixteen miles north of this city, shortly before 8 o'clock a. m. Seven persons lost their lives and over twenty were injured, several of the latter fatally. The train left Chicago at 11:15 and was due in this city at 8:30. Good time was being made when the trestle of the trestle jumped the track just as the edge of the trestle was reached. In this condition it was safely cleared by the engine, but the car and smoker, the ladies' day coach and the sleeper making up the rest of the train, were hurled over the side and across the trestle is supposed to have rebounded the rails, and when the ladies' day coach reached the trestle, it fell.

It was several minutes before any aid could be attempted and the flames were so large to be effective, as the flames had enlarged the entire car and had nearly extinguished the fire.
