To enact a law establishing a max-imum freight rate and repeal: the law creating the railway commission; to udopt the Australian ballot system; and to give expression in favor of the no coinage of silver.

That there is any such emergency

as justifies calling the legislature to-gether at this time is very doubtful, to say the least. The governor thinks ion of two weeks will be long enough to dispose of these matters, and that the cost will not exceed sixteen thousand dallars

On none of the questions the legisature will consider is there by any

neans a ununimous opinion among the people of the state, nor is it at all certain that the legislature will agree

with the governor on them.

That a maximum rate bill is desira ble, notwithstanding the clamer for it in certain quarters, is extremely doubtful, and a bill that could be preared, considered, and passed in two ks, would in all probability be a crude, imperfect, and possibly unjust piece of legislation. That the laws regulating the railway commission can be amended to make the commission more effective and more ac eptable to the state is true, but it not so certain that the commission should be done away with entirely.

As to the Australian ballot system the state has managed to get slong pretty well under the old system, and the matter could safely have been left for the next legislature to act upon, and a declaration that the state is in favor of the free coinage of silver-if it is in fact in favor of it-will have very little influence on the action of

very little influence on the action of congress in the matter. Many of the members of the legisla-ture will be candidates for re-election and there is danger-that sluking their own opinions, they will vote for any bill, however illy conceived, that they may think will strengthen them with may think will strengthen them with their constituents. Under the gircum-slances it is useless to expect wise leg-

Politically, the extra session is a mistake. To declare the position of the party on these and other matters might much better have been left to the state convention. 
