How the House Silver-Bill Reeds in the Senate.

AGAINST ALIEN LANDHOLDERS.

A measure that will save our soil for our citizens - a strong movement in favor of the Torrey Bankrupt Bill - Our Capital News.

WASHINGTON, June 10.—In the senate Mr. Cockrell spoke at length on the silver bill. Why, he asked, continue that legal discrimination and that relentless war against silver? The action of congress upon the silver question, he said, would affect not only the people of the United States directly, but would really affect indirectly all nations for ages to come. It should be decided without political prejudice. He denied that the free and unlimited coinage of silver bullion and the issue of certificates for every billion would be in derogation of any obligation to the creditors of the nation. Gold and silver should be put on a perfectly equal basis as coin and bullion. In season and out of season those who favored the unlimited coinage of silver were taunted with trying to flood the country with 72 cents dollars and the noble, grand national sentiment inscribed on the silver dollar "In God We Trust" was sneered at and derided as meaning "In God we trust for the other twenty-eight cents to make it one dollar." It was to be the duty of congress, regardless of the possible action of other nations, to retract its steps, correct the false impressions and apprehensions of European nations caused by unfounded representations and restore silver to a perfect equality with gold, both as coin and bullion.

Mr. Editor: Why do not our Wayne papers give to the public an account of the progress of all the industries of the place? If a new meat market starts up or a new grocery opens we are sure to hear of it through the papers together with the gain or loss to the community through such firms doing business in the city. If a new dry goods store commenced business, if a new house-hold process of printing the papers had been started, if the public of the town and from time to time note the progress of the new enterprise and the benefits or moral status of it—place by reason of such attention being here, there has in industry recently opened up in town of which we hear nothing through the papers.—One which the town people made a mighty effort to establish here according to law and for the public good. And the proprietors thereof or rather the agents of the people for the people exerted all their power at their command to plant the enterprise in this city—rebuilding of the town and vicinity both morally and financially, and the people we say hired these agents for a certain sum of money to run the business for them. That is the people's agents put into the town treasury a certain amount of their savings, all that time spent in discharging of their duties. The people of the town received whatever income there is from the result of the result of the business. Such as picking up and properly disposing of the products of the trade. The greater the amount of product the business carries into the street, the greater the amount of money in the hands of the town's market of the people. The agent's duties are done when the products are turned loose in the street, and their duties are well done according to the quantity and quality of the products turned over to the people. Then it becomes the people's duty through their officers to take those products and store them for a short time in the warehouse prepared for the purpose, then to bring them out, after they are sufficiently cured, through the police magistrates court, where the money is drawn from their pockets into the town treasury, then the refuse is either loaded up in a wagon and sent home to their robed families or stored away in the streets before the hill. These products of the business which arrive at the brick-house on the hill are delivered over into the copier's hands, and then the farming community are called upon for their share of the expense for storage and the proper care of the products of this money-making business until further disposal is made of them.

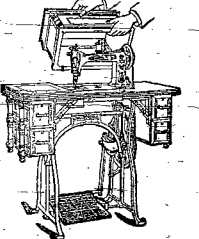

Senator Teller moved that the bill be printed and laid on the table.

Senator Vest raised the Senate to take up the consideration of the bill proposed from the select committee on the sale and transportation of meat products to the United States.

Senator Vest's motion, stating that for the adoption of two states were of more importance and should be taken up first.

A prominent senator participated by several senators present. Senator Stewart asked unanimous consent that on Friday next, at 1 o'clock, the Senate shall vote on the silver bill and all amendments proposed thereon.

The bill provided that no certificate shall be granted to any vessel plying a common carrier from the United States to a foreign country, unless the vessel is a citizen of the United States.

Mr. Ingalls asked the bill, Senator Vest moved to amend the bill by inserting the words "and for persons or parties having cattle for transport at the date of such contract sufficient to cover the duties on such cattle."

Senator Vest opposed the amendment and Senator Vest spoke in favor of it. The vote on the amendment was Yeas 46, Nays 20. No quorum having voted the Senate adjourned further action on the amendment, at 2 o'clock, adjourned.

Among the bills passed was one incorporating the King Theological Fund. The bill then went into committee of the whole on the bill affecting the Milwaukee Daily News, under the direction of the afternoon session.

There was a discussion of the measure, but no action was taken. The committee arose and then, at 5 o'clock, took a recess until 7 o'clock, the evening session to be for the consideration of certain bills.

No private petitions bills were passed at the evening session, owing to objection made by Mr. Eakin of Tennessee, but about thirty bills went over with the previous session.
