It is a significant fact connected with the Kausse pentientiary that the number of prisoners, when compared with the population, has been steadily decreasing for eight years past, and that that there has been an actual de orease in the number in confinement during the past two years. On the first day of January 1870, the state prisoners, (one including United States, civil or, military) numbers of the state of the stat number was 633, or one to every 1,574 in habitants; in 1885 the number was 673, or one to every 1885 inhabitants and on the first of January-1889, the state prisoners numbered 861, or one to every 1891 inhabitants. On the

The warden states in his biennial port, that more than sixty thousand minals are serving out sentences in felonics in the prisons of the United States, or about one prisoner for every thousand inhelitants. The same ruis in Kanaas would give our penitentiary-1,951 sate prisoners. We have today a total of only 801, or not much more than one-half the number of criminals per capita reported for the United States.


