Omaha is suspiciously well satisfied with the recent census.

The new census puts Illinois first in population among the states.

Kansas still suffers from hot, dry weather, and the largest estimate do not place the yield of corn at more than half that of an ordinary year.

According to the Journal the real estate men of Sioux City have formed an organization for the purpose of buying farm lands with a radius of a hundred miles of Sioux City.

General manager Clarke, of the Missouri Pacific, states positively that his road will not build to Yankton, never in the future, and that the northern terminus will remain at Omaha.

The Omaha Republican is huted again and is to change hands. As means to relieve its proprietors of the expense which they happened to have, the Republican has been a brilliant success.

There will be very little politics in the election of members of the legislature this year, and the man who is to represent this district must be able to get along without depending entirely on the party to pull him through.

One of the surprises of the census is the statement that Omaha has a larger population than Kansas City. The latter city complained vigorously of the result of the first count, and a second one was ordered; but, instead of showing the larger population claimed, actually lessened the first figures. As now given Omaha has 135,000 and Kansas City has but 132,000.

There is as yet no one suggested for the legislature from this county. It is not probable that the other counties in the electoral district will permit Wayne county to have the senator for this year, as we have had the senatorship for the last two terms, but Wayne county is entitled to the representative this year, and prospective candidates should begin to make their wishes known.

It is becoming more evident every day that the renomination of Dorsay will be a non-sequitur, and one of the republicans of the third district can not afford to make it. If the district was a close one his election would be impossible, and even with a republican majority of twelve votes, and it would be extremely doubtful. Thousands of republicans would be indifferent to his election or defeat, and hundreds would openly oppose him. In the counties where the alliance is strong the vote of that organization would be solid against him, and in such counties as this, where there is no alliance organization, he would lose a great many votes among the farmers, for they have lost all confidence in him. With an acceptable candidate the district is republican by a large majority, but with Dorsay as the candidate and a strong democratic nomination, it would be among the doubtful ones.

The resolution adopted by the county committee at the convention last Saturday will commend itself to the republicans of the county. It is a protest against the preliminary canvass prior to the nominating conven-

tion. The only objection that can be urged against it is that in some cases the people of the county may not be well acquainted with the candidates, and that under our system of nominating by primary votes, the candidate who happened to be best known would have an undue advantage. This objection is one that is advanced by the fact that it is followed this action would, to a large extent, put an end to the prolonged and bitter campaigns we have had in previous years, and which have caused the defeat of more than one republican candidate in this county. As we have had it heretofore the canvass for the nomination has often been more bitter than the campaign that followed it, and the successful candidate has found himself hampered from the start with a fight in his own party. This has been the principal objection to the primary system, and if it can be eliminated there will be no making or more satisfactory way of making nominations. It is true that the resolution is only a recommendation, and there is no direct way of enforcing it, but a candidate who would persist in ignoring a resolution of this kind would probably find when the votes were counted, that he had made a mistake.
