We suppose there will be no opposition to his nomination and that he will be easily elected.

The Wakefield Republican very justly suggests that the amendment relating to the increase of the number of judges of the supreme court should not be lost sight of in the excitement over the prohibition amendment. It is an amendment that should carry without fail. The supreme court is behind with its work, and getting farther behind with every term. Not only should they be increased but a sufficient salary should be paid to get the best available lawyers for the position.

The curfew bill as it came back from the conference committee is little better for the northwest than it was. It was originally passed by the house. It was hoped that binding twins would be placed on the free list, and that at least enough of the duty on sugar refined to give the growing beet sugar industry of Nebraska sufficient protection to enable it to go to a good vigorous state. It is no infant industry in fact as well as protection, and one that for ten years would be able to hold its own against the world. It would be seriously crippled by the tariff, but the reduction at this time will seriously cripple it. The West is getting a little too much jagged-handed protection, and the western senators are justified in refusing to support a bill that gives the East what it asks for and refuses the same protection to western industries.

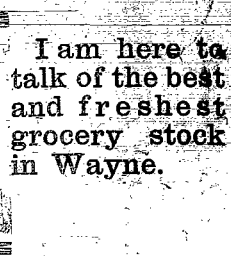
