## ALMOST A PANIC.

Wild Eyed Brokers and Rapidly Disappearing Margins.

MONEY CRIES FOR 90 PER CENT

The New York Stock Exchange on the verge of a Panic Caused by Reports from Abroad—Public Confidence Shaken—The Bank of England Shifts its View

NEW YORK, Nov. 11.—The dark clouds which have been hanging over Wall street for the last six months almost reached a climax of blackness yesterday morning. The Stock Exchange was on the verge of a panic during the first two hours. Money was almost unobtainable, and failures were imminent. London prices for securities were about 10 per cent. below the closing prices of Saturday. Money rates were high in London, and an untoward state of emergency was reported. When the market opened here there was a rush to sell stocks at any price. In the first ten minutes prices of active stocks had declined from 1 to 3 per cent. The excitement on the Stock Exchange was tremendous. It seemed as though it were impossible to find buyers, so greatly has public confidence been shaken by recent developments here and in Europe. The banks and trust companies, sharing in the general fright, began to call in loans and within half an hour the Stock Exchange was bare of money. The streets were full of brokers fighting about to obtain loans to make good their margins, who were unable to do so. The panic was so great that slight rallies occurred during the morning, due to buying by the bears, who are buying richly in the hope of the success of the street in general. Shortly before 12 o'clock the market again declined, and a dark and gloomy day over the Stock Exchange. Business was confined for half an hour, and the brokers had time to take a breathing spell and count up their losses. At about 1 o'clock the money lenders began to appear in the Exchange. They offered the best terms they could, and found eager takers. Rates quickly ran up to 25 and 50 per cent. and then to 75 per cent. and interest, which is equivalent to about 80 per cent. per year. At about the same time there came a sharp rally in the stock market and prices began to advance again. Among the greatest declines of the day was that of Manhattan's per cent. and Cleveland, Cincinnati, Chicago and St. Louis 6 per cent.

The impression seems to be gaining ground that some purposeful action on the part of the Bank of France may avert a panic in London, the reverberations of which will fall over the world. The situation in London is becoming painfully strained. South America, South Africa and Egypt, in all of which England's money interests are very large, are calling on the bank of England for more gold. And the bank can not respond. It is thought probable that the directors of the bank may soon advance the rate to an even higher figure than 75 per cent. The bank of France is said to have \$40,000,000 of gold. The bank's directors are probably minority. On Saturday they advanced the premium on gold coins.

Last of the Jay Cook Failure.  
PHILADELPHIA, Nov. 11.—The trustee of the estate of Jay Cook & Co. announced the payment of the final dividend upon claims presented before Monday next. The final dividend will be 31 per cent. in cash on \$3,077,000, and 41 shares of Northern Pacific preferred stock, 31 shares of Oregon Steamship and Navigation stock and 1 of a share of preferred stock of St. Paul and Duluth to each \$1,000 claim, to creditors holding that amount and upwards. With the payment of this dividend the affairs of Jay Cook & Co. will be wound up. The total cash paid on it will have been 104 per cent. on \$2,477,000. The liabilities of the firm failed in 1875 were \$1,000,000 but this amount has been reduced by litigation, compromise and various forms of redemption to the figure above named, less than 60 per cent. There were 3,200 creditors when the firm failed. There has been no dividend since 1881, when the fourth one was distributed. The fifth and final dividend brings the last chapter of this historic and honorable failure to a close. During the process of winding up the intricate affairs of the estate the Jay Cook interest has acquired back of the outstanding claims through redemption and purchase. In the distribution of bonds and stock to the creditors the amount in the aggregate realized has more than exceeded the extent of claims.

Will Run Its Own Streetcar.  
CHICAGO, Nov. 11.—Eight years ago the Chicago, Milwaukee and St. Paul Railroad company decided to turn over the management of its electric cars to the Pullman Palace Car company. Last night the contract between the two companies expired and the Chicago, Milwaukee and St. Paul again commenced the operation of operating the cars. By the action of the St. Paul road, which has about 4,000 miles of working car lines, the Pullman company loses the greatest line in the northwest and one of the most important districts.

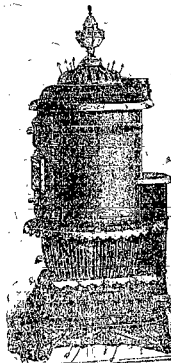
