The Dry Goods Chronicle of New York quotes the prices of woolen goods in January before the new tariff giving a complete table of the different grades of lannels, jeans, etc., and in every instance they are in favor of the prices in January after the new tariff. For example: Ballardvale white flannels, viz. silk. warp., 7—8 before the new tariff was 274 c. 4 first the January after the new tarin. For example: Ballardvale whitefland, nels, viz; silk warp, 7—8 before the new tariff 75, Stephens B.
