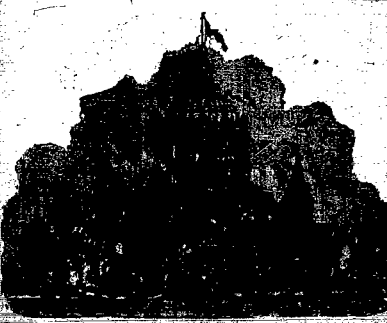

BAD NEWS
A Desperate Negro Runs Amuck in Peoria Streets.
A WEALTHY KENTUCKIAN SLAIN

By a Jealous Farmer Had a Western Cavalry man slain by the murderer in the Fire Works - A Tacoma Bank Teller Decapitated.
PEORIA, Ill., Aug. 26.—George Barry, a negro, ran amuck in the streets of Peoria and viciously stabbed and slashed three persons, all of whom are in a critical condition. He quarreled with a negro woman in a house on Water street. The woman fled when the fiend drew a knife, but he overtook her, knifed her to the ground, and began cutting her in a savage manner, when two police officers appeared on the scene. Sergeant Sloan, knowing the desperate character of the negro, did not propose to take any chances and tried to shoot him, but his revolver missed fire. Barry then sprang on him with all the fury of the wild animal and nearly cut the officer's throat. The fiend and head. Policeman Campbell who went to Sloan's aid, was also seriously injured. Leaving his three victims wallowing in their blood, he sprang down the street thrashing viciously at every one who came in his way. He was arrested by Officer Sliver, who succeeded in knocking him down and arresting him. If any of his victims died the murderer will probably be lynched.

To Watch the Timber Thieves.
DUNCAN, Minn., Aug. 26.—It will be remembered that some time ago there was considerable stir over alleged stealing of American timber along the frontier of the Boundary river, south of the international boundary. The government sent two investigating expeditions from Fort Snare, Minn., to the Boundary river to Baty lake and river. As a result of these expeditions it has now been decided by the interior department to establish a permanent government post on Baty river and two officers of the department are now there to select a location and put the needed buildings. The post will be located near Fort Snare, about a hundred and fifty miles northwest of Duluth. The fort is the headquarters of watching timber stealers from the Canadian side. Fully twenty million feet of timber have been stolen here in the past three years.

Millions of Pine Slabs.
ASHLAND, Wis., Aug. 26.—Government agents are after some one at the Fond Du Lac agency, in Minnesota. Ten million feet of pine have been cut on the reservation. One of the inspectors has been sent to the agency. The Indian Agent Leahy has left for the west of making investigations. The timber was cut on the reservation. The matter has not been reported to the Indian agents at Fond Du Lac reservation. The land has been removed, and wholesale arrests will be made. The Indian agent in charge of the general land office, which has requested Mr. Leahy to make a personal inspection.

A Wealthy Farmer Murdered.
LOUISVILLE, Aug. 26.—Frank Hughes, a wealthy Kentucky farmer at Wood Lake, Ky., was murdered by one of his farm hands, named John Dudley. The latter suspected Hughes of being too intimate with his wife. Thinking the latter was in the room, he broke open the door and without waiting to verify his suspicions emptied a shotgun into the victim's body, killing him instantly. Finding that he had made a fatal mistake, he surrendered to the authorities and coolly pleaded self-defense. The murdered man is connected with many of the best families in Kentucky. The murderer will be lynched probably.

The Park Place Disaster.
NEW YORK, Aug. 26.—Two more bodies were taken from the ruins of 11 o'clock, bringing the total number recovered up to fifty. Another of the Italian laborers was detected searching a coat which was found in the ruins. He was hustled off to jail at double quick speed. At 120 a. m. the workers in the ruins brought to view, but the workmen will not be able to remove them for several hours as they are wedged in the timber. This will make fifty-two bodies that have succumbed in the ruins. Twenty-two bodies were at the morgue at 2 p. m., sixteen of which were identified.

A Tacoma Teller Decapitated.
TACOMA, Wash., Aug. 26.—Edward Albertson, secretary and teller of the Fidelity Trust Company bank, is a defaulter and fugitive. He made a clear run of his enormous bank account, taking it from the vault Saturday. President Wallace said: "We have not the faintest clue as to which way Albertson went. His motive is likewise a mystery. He was probably the most prudent man in Tacoma, and seemed entirely wrapped up in his wife and babe. We all had the utmost confidence in him." Mrs. Albertson is prostrate.

Elizabeth, Colo., Aug. 26.—Fred C. Mason, manager of the Merino stock farm, near this place, was shot and killed by W. Berry, one of the herders. The shooting was the outcome of a quarrel over wages. After the shot the herder mounted a horse and rode rapidly away. A posse of citizens set out in search of the fugitive, but as yet the capture has not been effected. If Berry is caught he will be lynched.
