CHOSEN BY BALLOT

Flower Elected Governor in the Empire State.

M'KINLEY WINS IN OHIO.

The Democrats Again Select Russell in Massachusetts.

BOIES FOR GOVERNOR OF IOWA.

Brown Called in Maryland-Kansas Republicans Fall Everywhere, Together and Make Unopposed Gains-Pennsylvania Goes Republican-New Jersey Democratic-Nebraska and Colorado Republican-The Parties Break Even in Illinois-The Congressional Elections-Receiving Returns at the White House-Indicators of the Day.

New York, Nov. 4.-Never in the history of the state did an election day dawn fairer. It was cold and crisp in the early hours, but it grew warmer as the day wore on, while a gentle rain in a clear blue sky showed down with strict regularity your rights and wrongs, winners and losers alike. From a political standpoint the weather was regarded as a square deal all around, for it was a

certain anxiety of a big vote and no fear. In this respect, however, it was thought the genial skies would favor the Republicans, especially in the country districts, where many voters stay at home when the weather and the roads are bad. The weather throughout the state was pleasant and a big vote was brought out in the city election districts. New York, Nov. 4.-The City Book association says Flower's majority in the state will be about 25,000.

A World bulletin gives Flower a plurality of 15,000 in Kings county. The Tribune says Flower's plurality in the state is estimated at 15,000. A Press bulletin says the Republican state committee conceded Flower's majority in the state.

The claim to the gubernatorial and three close Democratic opponents, Herlin, Hancock and Panning-which have heretofore been in doubt, have been won by Republican candidates for the legislature. The entire Republican ticket will be elected." Immediately afterward the Democratic committee room was thronged with Democrats. "Everything is lost. McKinley will carry the state by at least 15,000, anything above that you can see your own chances, for you are swept under." "How about the legislature?" was asked. "Well, they take that, too, but I cannot tell by what majority." This is the first news given out at Democratic headquarters, but it has been noticed that no high degree of attention has been felt there all evening since the first returns were received. Hilarity reigns supreme in all Republican headquarters.

Alliance vote was the largest ever polled in this city. McKinley ran ahead of the Democrats in the state and will carry this city by 600 plurality.

Ohio-McKinley's plurality, gives the Democrats a gain of 200. Donahoe goes Republican by 31, a gain of 63. It is the second time that the Democrats have carried this city.

Indicators point to McKinley's election by about 15,000 plurality. Five hundred and seventy precincts outside of Cincinnati gave Russell 50,429, Campbell 76,637. The same districts in 1888 gave Ryan, R., 82,887 and Campbell 100,000.

Campbell Beats the News. Governor Campbell virtually conceded the election of McKinley. The United Press man called upon him in his office at midnight and found him in anything but cheerful mood, surrounded by members of his family and intimate friends. Said he upon being asked for an opinion: "I have no doubt, but I am being questioned further, he continued: "The situation is not looking anything but favorable for me. My private affairs are still now have been very satisfactory and I am confident that my Western Union wires, I do not know where these election returns come from and how they are made up."

Personal rights and selfish interests have defeated the republican party in Wayne county for four years, and yet the HERALD is not surprised. One of the first causes when such matters are at stake, of the party, no party in the county can expect to put up good men and witness the election of the entire ticket upon which they are placed. But as the office had refused it was written to the \$387.83 as disclosed in last week's HERALD, the sum of \$1,380 (instead of \$1,000 as we stated in the issue of the 22nd) is the amount saved by the county during Mr. Steele's term of office." In other words, as the Watchman is very dull of comprehension, it costs the county \$1,380 more to attend to the duties of the office for a term now than it did during Mr. Steele's administration. The Watchman can not get otherwise. It only asks the election is over and we do not care to continue the discussion because we believe the people are hourly sick of it.
