PLAGUE STRICKEN.

Asiatic Black Tongue Puzzling Indiana-Physicians.

ST. LOUIS MILLION DOLLAR FIRE.

St. Paul Fire & Marine Insurance Co. A fearful story of disaster in a Wisconsin Hunting Camp—Other Crimes and Executions.

NOBLESVILLE, Ind., Nov. 18.—Asiatic "black tongue" is afflicting the people of Kirkland. Five deaths have occurred in one family and seven more deaths is the last report. Physicians plead ignorance of the nature of the disease and cannot successfully treat it.

Story of Horrible Murder.

WEST STENOGRAPH, Wis., Nov. 18.—James McBride, who is in the hospital at Grand Rapids, Minn., tells a story of a horrible murder committed in the woods near Lake Umbagog. McBride was one of a party of hunters, which included Thomas Redding, Pony Babo, James Bruce and two other men, who went up to the Babo lake country to spend the winter, taking supplies and a quantity of liquor. Near the Canadian boundary the party quarreled over the disposition of the liquor, and Redding, Bruce and McBride took sides against the other three men. One night, while McBride and Bruce were sleeping, they were seized and tied to trees, and the other men went through the packs for the liquor, which they found and started to drink. McBride tried to get away, when Babo threw a rifle at him, breaking his arm. They then cut him loose and ordered him to get out. McBride had not gone far when he fell from pain. At daylight he returned to the camp and found Redding tied to a tree and his head blown almost entirely off. White Bruce lay in a pool of blood at his feet, shot in a dozen places and his head bent to one jelly. The packs and camp equipment had all been taken away and the other men were nowhere to be found.

Big Fire at St. Paul.

St. Paul, Nov. 18.—About 11 o'clock last night fire broke out in a large five-story building on the corner of Third and Wacouia streets in the heart of the business district, owned by Griggs, Cooper & Co., and in half an hour it was apparent the establishment was doomed.

Nearly the whole fire department was at work on the fire and with the greatest difficulty have the flames been prevented from spreading, and saving out millions of dollars' worth of property. The firemen suffered considerably from the cold weather. Occasional explosions of oil make the work dangerous. Nothing is left of the great stock of groceries with which the building was stored and the building itself is almost entirely destroyed. Loss \$200,000.

Frank Almy Warned.

PLYMOUTH, N. H., Nov. 18.—The feeling of Christie Warden's friends toward her slayer was fully reflected by an incident which occurred here Monday night. An effigy of her murderer, Frank Almy, was hung across one of the principal streets with a circular sign in front thereof, which read as follows: "Almy, this was done by friends of Christie Warden. Will take the original next." The taking of the testimony before Chief Justice Doe and Judge Allen, to determine the degree of murder in the case of Almy, who pleaded guilty, began. The effigy was also hung in the store of Almy's residence in their family and detailed the murder scene. Almy frequently slept there.

A Riot in Oklahoma.

GUTHRIE, O. T., Nov. 18.—A courier arrived from Chandler brings news of a riot there at 3 o'clock a. m. The soldiers from the company stationed there under Lieutenant Scott got drunk, and upon being ejected from a saloon, they opened fire on a crowd of citizens who were gathered in front of the saloon. Sheriff Parker received a bullet through his leg. Matthew Reeves was also shot through the leg and terribly wounded on the head by a stone. A soldier who was not in the riot was standing by, was fatally shot through the body. After considerable excitement the rioters were locked up.

The Omaha Looting Case.

OMAHA, Nov. 18.—At the conclusion of the evidence the leading witness, Prosecuting Attorney Mahoney made that Captain O'Donoghue be discharged. The court agreed, and the case against the captain was dismissed. Judge Foley then stated that he would also discharge "Ugale Jiminy" Cannon, as there was no evidence to show that the old scout had done any work toward bringing the city-rioting to a close.

Robbery in Indiana.

INDIANOLA, Ind., Nov. 18.—A gang of burglars and safe blowers visited this place and shattered three safes in as many different stores. The thieves secured \$1,000 in stamps and \$50 in cash and registered letters and packages from the postoffice safe, but failed to get any booty from the safes in the stores of John Dykes and El. R. McKee, both of which were opened, the latter being blown.

Chattanooga Business Blocks Destroyed.

CHATTANOOGA, Tenn., Nov. 18.—Six ten-story office business buildings in Center Street, the property of W. A. Foster, were burned to the ground. The great store of T. H. Chase and the Chattanooga Medicine company occupied one of the burned buildings. The total loss is about \$500,000 with small insurance.

Wisconsin's Ex-Treasurer.

MADISON, Nov. 18.—The hearing of the suits against ex-Treasurer Harshaw and ex-Treasurer Macfarlane were begun in the circuit court before Judge A. W. Newman. The suits are brought against the ex-officio trustees for the purpose of recovering interest received by them upon public funds deposited in banks during their term of office.

WASHINGTON, Nov. 18.—United States Minister Albert G. Porter, the representative of this government to Italy, called on Secretary Blaine at the department of state. Minister Porter stated that his visit had no significance and that he simply called to pay his respects to the secretary before going to his home in Indiana.

TRIALO SPRINGS, Colo., Nov. 18.—Two miners, named John Wright and James Harvey, were instantly killed in the Matthe mine. The men failed to come up after the dinner and a mine-was sent down and found both dead. It is supposed a premature blast caused their death. Both were married men.

New York, Nov. 18.—The twenty-four passengers on board the grounded steamer State of California have all been safely landed at the shipping company's dock in Brooklyn. The vessel lies away and it is expected she will be floated off the sand bar.
