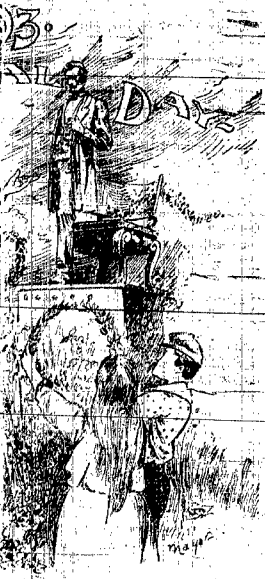

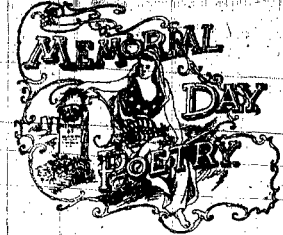

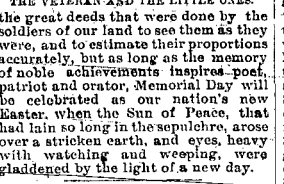
We honor the great generals and statesmen who directed the affairs of the army and the nation during that most critical time, but our institutions are our freedom and our democracy are the thousands of brave private soldiers who all nameless graves on the hillsides and in the valleys of the South. No storied marble tells the tale of how they fell, but their agony is the artillery of the freed slave, the hymn of grateful labor and the thanksgiving of grateful people. It is due to them that no Gulf of treacherous hatred divides the North and South, but that from the Atlantic to the Pacific, from the Gulf to the northernmost borders of our territory, where a soldier lies buried, no matter whether he fought under the stars and stripes or under the stars and bars, his grave is covered with flowers, the fitting type of the reverence for those who fell for the free and in agreement already in all the future springs of the world.

This day, sacred to the past, is to us an anniversary unlike any other, for as we lay our tribute upon the graves of those who fell in battle, or who have since lain down weary with the "march of life," to await the bugle call upon the resurrection, our hearts show their pledges to their ideals. The soldier to us is not merely an armed mercenary, who grudgingly pays his debt to his State, by being armed for a certain number of months or years, but he is the citizen, the merchant, the artisan, the clerk, farmer, who at the need of his country, transforms himself into the guardian of his institutions. He is the living embodiment of light and law, of civilization and patriotism. America needs no idle troops of armed warriors to save her face by their deeds of military pomp. The spirit of her people is more formidable to aggressors than any such display could be.

It was this spirit that made the contest of the civil war so remarkable. American freedom, American justice, American principles, to spend the "last drop of their blood, and the last dollar of their treasure."

Wherever is told the story of Chickamauga, Shiloh, and Manassas by the veterans whose hair is growing gray with the winters of peace, and whose slow steps are approaching close to the last bivouac, the victor has praise for the vanquished, and the defeated rejoices that their beloved land is still a part of the great republic and that secession failed.

A few years more, and only the children and children's children will be left to recount the deeds of valor of the heroes of the four years conflict, but as we travel away from their deeds in the true perspective of our national prosperity, they will show themselves in their right proportions. Old animosities are dead, and their hateful forms are covered away out of sight under the fruitful fruits of the years, but we are yet too new

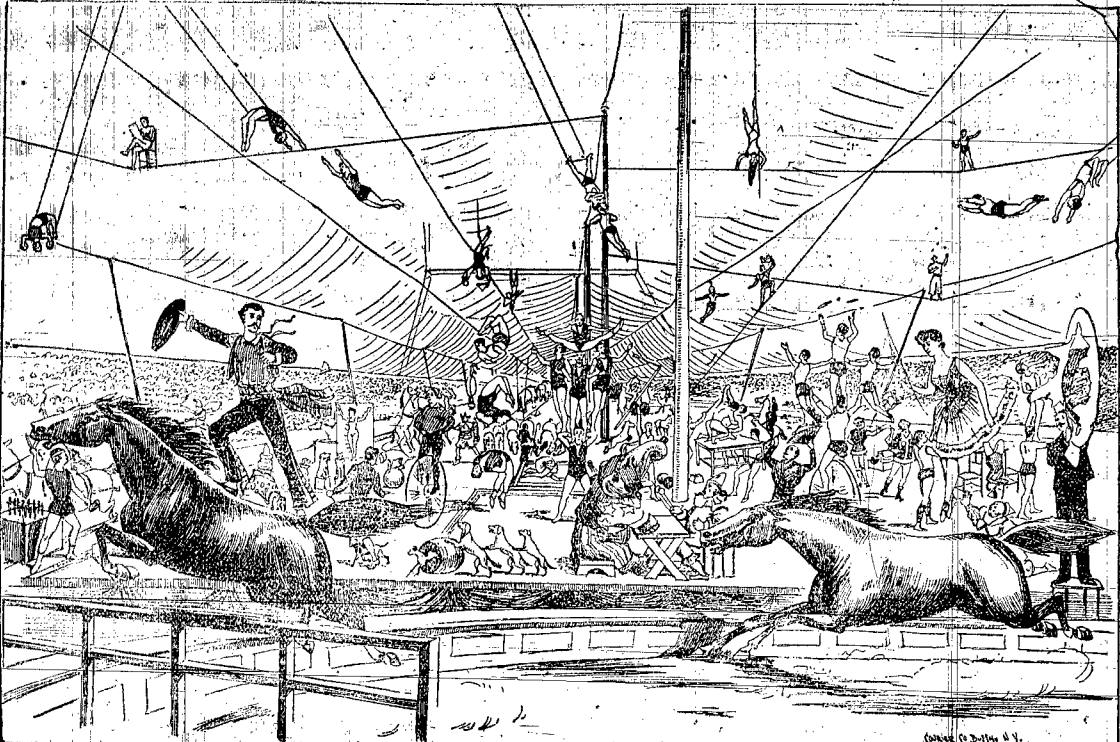
