Washington, May 20.—Assistant Atlorncy General Colby today made his report to the secretary of agriculture on the weather bureau investigation. He enters into voluminous details to sustain his conclusions that the system of management adopted by the chief of the weather bureau in addition to the objection of being without authority of law, has resulted in the relieving of subordinate officials from responsibility and, in the enter absence of the business methods so poticeable in the general conduct of the executive work. Neither the chief of the bureau nor any subordinate officer is regarded as responsible for the vast amount of property or the funds of the government in his charge, although over \$600,000 have been expended through the officers of the bureau during the year. 
