

### LAW AS INTERPRETED.

LAW AS INTERPRETED.

Statute to license and regulade the business of commission merchafts, or persons selling agricultural products and farm produce on commission, is lack, in State ex rel. Book vis. Wagener (Minn.), ad L. R. A. 42, to be a valid exercise of the police power, and not in infelingement of the constitutional rights; of such merchants.

A statute making it unha wful to work more than eight hours per day in mines or smelters is held, in re Morgan (Colo.) 47 L. R. A. 52, to be in violation of constitutional guaranties of illustry and the right to acquire, possess, and protect property, notwithstanding a decision of the Supreme Court of the United States holding that the Federal Constitution was not violated by such a statute.


