





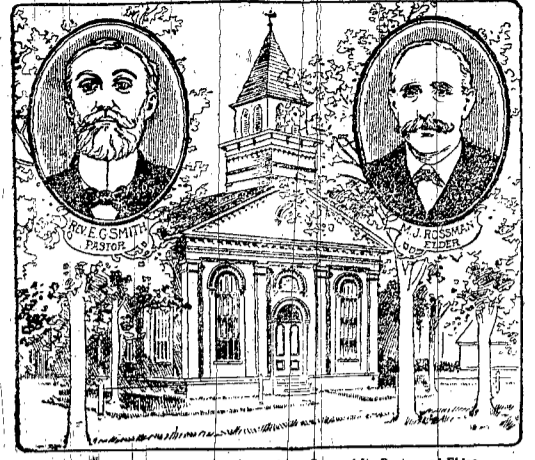

John A. Johnson, a manufacturer of Madison, Wis., has offered \$40,000 to the Board of Supervisors of Dane County, Wis., for the purpose of erecting and maintaining a home for aged people. In addition to the regular method of entering the home, by the payment of not less than \$200, Mr. Johnson has conceived the idea of issuing policies similar to insurance policies, which may be taken out by people in youth or middle age, to provide for their support and comfort in old age, or which may be taken out by any one for the support of a friend.

It is not generally known, perhaps, that Senator Pettigrew, of South Dakota, has a son who has been fighting with the Boers. He arrived in Savannah a few days ago and at once went to Washington. He is a lad of 20 years of age, who joined some 400 volunteers for service in the Transvaal. He was driven into the Portuguese territory and there dispersed, and the Dutch government paid his passage home.

Lieut. Gov. Bates, of Massachusetts is interested in sociology, and with a view to studying social conditions with his own eyes, recently created some sensation by visiting, in charge of several politicians, Boston's Chinatown and North End.

Nellie Grant's daughter is soon to become a bride. Her name is Nellie Sartoris. Mrs. Sartoris has been residing in Washington, where as Nellie Grant she was exceedingly popular during her father's administration. She is highly accomplished, a linguist and a brilliant conversationalist. Her fiancé is Timothy Nichols, a wealthy young resident of New York.

Dr. Oscar Lovey, who resigned from the United States Department to be a member of the faculty of agriculture of the Japanese Imperial University at Tokio, will receive a salary of \$7,000.

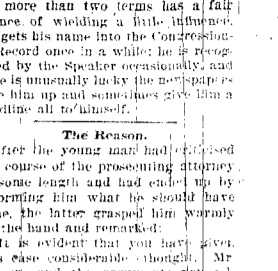
