BIRDS ARE GOOD SURGEONS. Many Feathered Creatures Have a Knowledge of Its Principles. Naturalists are well aware of the fact that a considerable number of the bird creation possess a knowledge of the principles of surgery that is not far from supernatural. The manner in which they endeavor to aid nature is very interesting.

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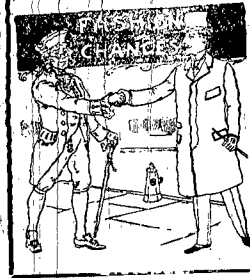
