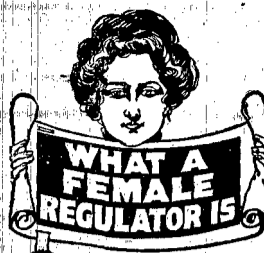

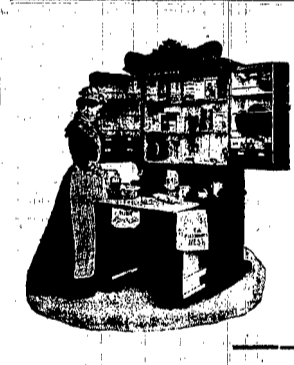

The five chickens seemed to be a week older than the rest of the family, and so they were for they hatched out one week earlier than the remainder of the family. This was an Indiana hen.—Homestead.
