





THE BEST TIME TO DIP.

It is advisable to dip cat tle twice in the fall and twice in the spring, at intervals of ten or twelve days; or during the summer when any skin disease is visible. Yet it is difficult to persuade owners to dip cattle at intervals of ten or twelve days. Experienced men say that it is best to dip twice in the fall regardless of the condition of the cattle.

I dipped 110 head of S. E Auker's on the 12th that went through in fine shape and he reports them doing spleudid. I expect to re-dip them again in ten or twelve days. I had a little bad luck with the first small bunch, so I cleaned my tank and charged it with different dip that is all right.
