Promise Made.

A Washington dispatch says that the President is preparing to redeem his promise made to the Philippine people through Secretary Taft that they shall have a parliament of their own, conditioned upon their good behavior for a term of two years, and it is understood that Secretary Taft himself will proceed to the Philippines next spring to witness the installation of the new form of representative government.

On March 27, 1905, the Philippine ensus was published, and consequently two years from that date—March 27, 1907—under the terms of the act of Congress, the President will direct the Philippine commission to call a general decicion for the choice of delegates to what will be known as the Philippine assembly. Tais body is to take over all legislative powers herefore exercised by the Philippine commission in all that part of the archi-
