

outbreak of the Civil War he sold the Republican and went to Wash-ington, becoming the private set-retary of Secretary Seward. He was entrusted with the delivery of the message releasing Mason and Slidell, who had been selzed from a British ship while on their way as ambassadors to Great Britain and France for from a British ship while on their way as ambassadors to Great Britain and France from the Confederate states. He might have made a million at that time by betraying his secret to Wall Street. After the war Col. Webster returned to Nebraska and engaged in raising live stock. 




