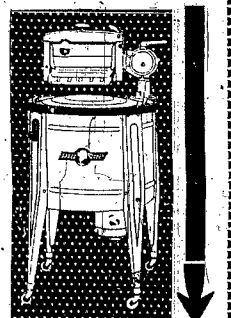
Wayne Boys Like Camp In Oregon
