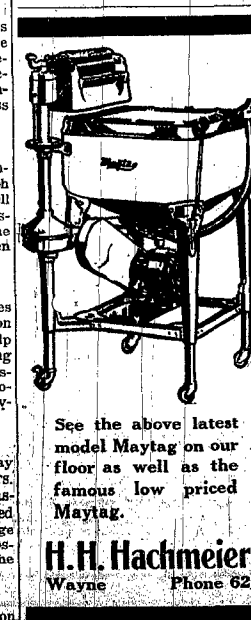

Tested Recipes. Crisp Nut Cookies. (Mrs. E. F. Winter, Hoskins) 1 cup butter, 2 cups brown sugar, 2 eggs, 2 teaspoons vanilla, 4 cups sugar sifted, 4 teaspoons (level) baking powder, 1 small teaspoon salt, 1 1/2 cups chopped nuts, Cream butter and sugar. Add eggs and vanilla. Beat well. Mix dry ingredients together and sift dry well until well blended. This is a stiff dough. Form into a roll and cover with wax paper and chill thoroughly. Cut into thin slices and bake. Remove from pan at once. This makes about 80 cookies.

Peanut Cookies. (Mrs. E. F. Winter, Hoskins) 1 cup sugar, 1 cup brown sugar, 1 cup peanut butter, 3 eggs, 1 1/2 teaspoon salt, 2 cups soda, 3 cups flour, Cream sugar, butter and peanut butter. Sift flour, soda and salt together and add to creamed mixture. Form into small balls and place in greased pan; crisp-cooked with fork and bake until golden brown.

- Crisp Nut Cookies. Mrs. E. F. Winter, Hoskins) 1 cup butter 2 cups brown sugar 2 eggs 2 teaspoons vanilla 4 cups sugar sifted 4 teaspoons (level) baking powder 1 small teaspoon salt 1 1/2 cups chopped nuts Cream butter and sugar. Add eggs and vanilla. Beat well. Sift dry ingredients together and mix well until well blended. This is a stiff dough. Form into a roll and cover with wax paper and chill thoroughly. Cut into thin slices and bake. Remove from pan at once. This makes about 80 cookies.
