Heredity Bears Little Relation To Intelligence
 "Very little relation is apparent between heredity and intelligence," according to Dr. Donald Snugg of Toronto, Canada, former Wayne student, who addressed the Mid-Western Psychology association at Urbana, Ill., in May.
 Reporting on a study of 312 chil-

dren placed in foster homes by the Toronto Infants' Home and of their mothers, Dr. Snugg showed that the effect of heredity upon the intelligence quotient is much less than many have supposed. The survey covered the children's home records for eight years and considered only those whose mother's intelligence rating had been established.
 The best showing, according to

Dr. Snugg, was by children whose mothers were in the average intelligence group. The 77 mothers produced 17 children whose intelligence rated in "superior class." Subnormal mothers had a slightly higher percentage of dull children.
 "There appears to be some correlation between the intelligence quotient of mothers and of their children who have been reared in foster homes, but the relationship

is so slight that knowledge of a mother's intelligence quotient is of very little value in predicting the intelligence quotient of her child," Dr. Snugg concluded.
 Dr. Snugg was psychologist for the junior court in Toronto last summer when he made the surveys on which he based his intelligence study. He plans to do the same work this summer.
 In September Dr. Snugg goes to

the University of Arkansas at Fayetteville as instructor in psychology. He was graduated from Wayne college in 1924, took his M. A. degree at the University of Iowa and received his Ph. D. at the University of Toronto two years ago. Since getting his doctor's degree he has instructed in the psychology department at the University of Toronto.
 Mrs. Snugg is doing social wel-

fare study in Toronto. In association with Miss Bell of England, she is helping poorer families keep budgets of expenditures to determine a minimum wage scale.
 Dr. and Mrs. Snugg plan to stop in Wayne in August enroute to their new home in Arkansas.
