County Board. Wayne, Nebraska, May 21, 1940. Board met as per adjournment. All members present.

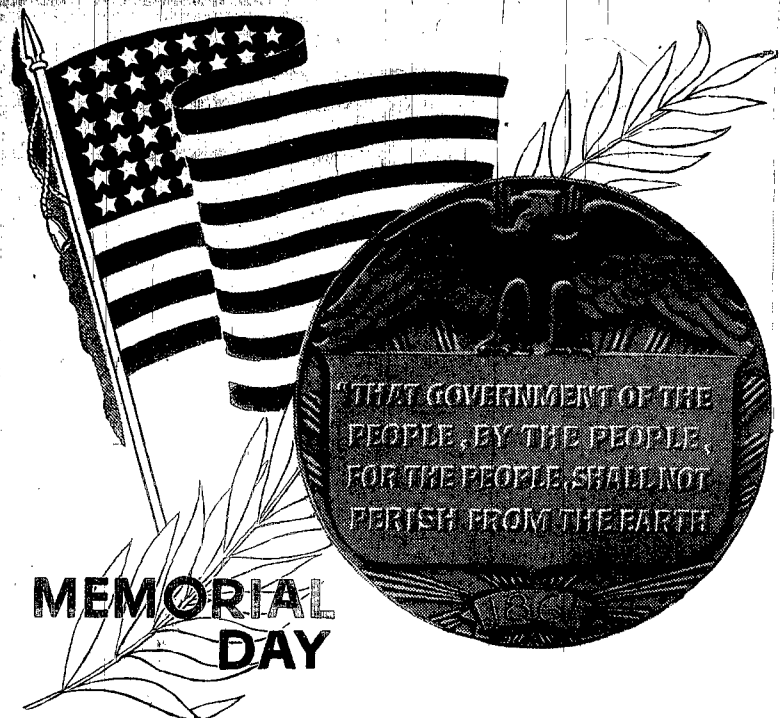
