Temperature changed from below zero to 60 above and snow melted fast. Geo. Bryant, who made his home with his sister, Mrs. F. M. Skeen, died in March, 1905. J. S. Gamble and family moved here from Elba, Kan., and will live on the Rawhouser farm. Andrew and Nels Granquist and Peter Paulson families are moving to Wayne from Minnesota. Ezra Beckenhauer and Miss Lydia Haglund were married March 8, 1905. John Johnson of Hartington and Miss Anna Larsen were married March 8, 1905. Jacob Reichert died at Winside February 23, 1905, at the age of 67. Fremont McManigal, 6, son of Mrs. S. T. McManigal, died March 8, 1905. Mr. McManigal and two other children died a couple of years before. Paul Lasse of Winner and Miss Grace Bell of Wayne were married April 30, 1905. The Twentieth Century club gave party at the home of Rev. and Mrs. C. S. Hughes at Carroll for Mr. and Mrs. Frank Owen who are moving to Wayne. Bond Issue Settled. From Ponca Journal for March 28, 1884: The supreme court decided in favor of Dixon county in the suit filed by Marshall Field. This was a suit on past-due coupons of bonds issued by Dixon county to the Covington, Columbus and Black Hills railroad. The bonds were in the sum of \$87,000. After their issue it was apparent that the company had not built and would not build the proposed railroad. After the bonds were voted it was found that Dixon county would have only about four miles of road instead of about 20. Judge Barnes had defeated bonds issued in Wayne county and he was secured to fight the issue in Dixon county. Some 20 suits were started to collect interest coupons. Litigation went on for more than a year. Finally the bond issue was declared unconstitutional as the bonds were issued to the amount of 15 per cent of the valuation of the county whereas under the constitution of the state only 10 per cent could be legally issued.

Oscar Peterson, former Dixon county judge, has been appointed port of entry inspector at South Sioux City. Ellis Iverson of Ponca, was named state gasoline inspector.
