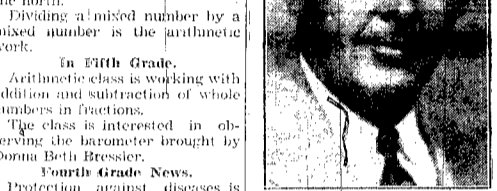
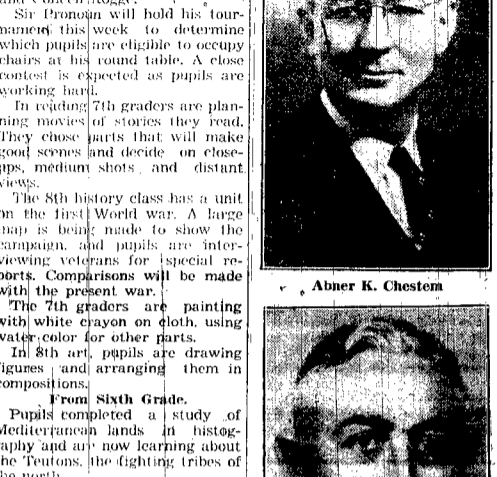

This price of 61 cents per bushel, is somewhat under the actual redemption price prior to these dates. It is believed that this price will encourage the borrowers to redeem this corn for feed and thereby add to the much needed increase in livestock production.
