

"Lest I be misunderstood. I do not for one minute detract from the heroiq flight Russia waged against the invading nati hordes, to emerge as one of the great powers of the world. We must not let the anties of the American leonmunist prejudice us against this great nation which has the right tol any form of government it desires, nor must we judge the great Russian people by the lunatic fringe which represents the great majority of American communists."

Speaking of juvenile delinquency, which has been on the increase, Mr. Hoover places major blame on the home and asks that parents be held personally responsible for the crimes of their children. He said:
