



### Taft Loses More Ground

Taft Loses More Ground

Win or lose, Harold E. Stassen has given Senator Robert Taft, number one favorite of so-called old guard, standpat republicans, plenty to worry about. First, the young Minnesota candidate for the GOP presidential nomination won a smashing victory in Wisconsin, and he followed it up with a decisive win in Nebraska's primary, despite Taft backing from Nebraska Senator Hugh Butlef. Now, Stassen is challenging Taft in the Senator's home state. Ohio, and pre-primary reports indicate that he may be far more popular there than Taft had believed possible.

Adding to Taft's worries was the Gallup poll report issued over the weekend, which placed Stassen at the head of all republican presidential hopefuls, closely followed by Dewey. Taft ran a poor fifth trailing both General MacArthur, who made a dismal showing in his home state of Wisconsin, and Senator Vandenburg, another Wisconsin man who says he's not a candidate at all.

In the midwest, at least, one thing seems clear: Republican voters want a progressive candidate at the head of their ticket. In Nebraska and Wisconsin they gave their support to Stassen, a progressive midwesterner. But they also gave strong

gressive candidate at the head of their ticket. In Nebraska and Wisconsin they gave their support to Stassen, a progressive midwesterner. But they also gave strong support to Dewey, an easterner who also must be counted as a progressive. They apparently do not approve Senator Taft, who, able though he may be, has shown little willingness to adjust his views and policies to the changes being made in a changing world.

Never again can our nation return to its isolation and aloofness from the rest of the world. We are a part of that world; most other nations look upon us as the leading world power, and as such they look to us for leadership. We cannot ignore it, and midwesterners seem to be becoming increasingly aware of this fact.

In the light of past records and performances, coupled with actions and words during the campaign, it seems only logical that Dewey and Stassen are the leaders, while Taft ranks far down the list.


### A Worthy Program
