One of the most common excuses offered by drivers on their accident reports is this: I didn't see! One drivers says, "I didn't see the other vehicle approaching until it was too chose to avoid hitting him." And another driver pleads, "I didn't see that there was a train crossing until I was right up to it." Perhaps the victims of these mounting accidents didn't see the other car or the person or the train. But the real underlying reason for the accidents probably is a plain case of not paying attention to the important ob of driving.

Keeping an alert watch for changing road conditions is a fundamental rule of protecting oneself on the highway. To make it easier and safer for drivers—the highway authorities signals and painted markings. But these signs alone cannot profect us from the hidden dangers lurking on the streets and highways of our state. No, it will come only when the driver himself will pay attention to his driving instead of listening to his passengers or vatching the crop conditions along the road, are allowing himself to fall into a trance;

Madern conveniences and monotony of the open road, may be one of the things that lollst the average driver into a false sense of safety. The long, white lines on the pavement, the soft music on the car radio and the monotonous flat, level country-side sometimes produce hypnotic trances that, when broken may produce dire results. A sudden honking of a horn, the sight of a person walking along the roadway, or the realization that you are driving on the wrong side of the road may suddenly jerk you back to consciousness, but, that may be just a half second too late.

Yes, it's true that the drivers involved in accidents perhaps didn't see, but the principle question still leoms high on the horizon—"Were you looking and paying attention?"
