Nebraska's Road Expenditures

Nebraska's Read Expenditures

Anyone genuinely concerned with
bettering Nebraska's highways will find
some interesting financial figures in a
booklet, "Facts Pertaining to the State
Highway System," recently issued by the
state department of roads and irrigation.

For example, Nebraska apparently
reals nearly at the bottom of the list of
the 48 states "with regard to the percentage of motor-fuel tax receipts used for
tate highway purposes." A chart for the
year 1946 places Nebraska 44th in the nation in this respect, with the department
of roads and irrigation receiving about 50
percent of the gasoline tax receipts. Five
states turn 100 percent of these receipts
over to their state highway departments,
and the national average is nearly 70 percent.

Another chart shows Nebraska 40th Another chart shows Nebraska 40th in the nation on the percentage of net more vehicle tax receipts used for state highway purposes in 1946. Nebraska's allocation of motor vehicle tax collections for state highways totaled slightly over 38 percent in that year, while seven states used 100 percent for state roads and the average was 65 percent for all states.

Maintenance costs, too, are far higher. In 1926 the state maintained 6,156 miles of roads at a total cost of \$2,022,556.63, while in 1947 it maintained 9,253 miles (am increase of little more than 3,000 miles) at a total cost of \$5,488,589.48 (well over twice as much expense).
