But we don't want to even have that kind of a story to publish around here, because for everyone who "just loses his clothes" in such an accident there are dozens who get injuries so serious that they become lifetime handicaps.

SO PLEASE, FRIENDS—BE CAREFUL! We want to put your name in the paper . . but not because you have lost a hand in a picker accident.

### **Healthy Sign**

The meat eating habits of the American people were recently surveyed by a bureau of the U.S. Agricultural Research Administration. The surveys were conducted in 68 American cities in every part of the country, and were confined to housekeeping families of two or more persons.

Total meat consumption for the average family came to 8.124 pounds a week. Some of the families, of course, ate less, while others ate more.

of the families, of course, ate less, while others ate more.
Greatest consumption was in the case of beef—the average was slightly more than 3.2 pounds a week. Pork was next on the list of favorites with about 2.9 pounds.
Coming down to specific cuts of meat, pot roasts and other roasts appeared to lead in popularity. Ground beef also won wide acceptance. The greatest favorites in pork were hain, bacon and chops.
This is a country of avid meat eaters. The average family builds at least one meal a day, and often more, around meat. That is a situation in which taste and sound dietary habits coincide.
Current forecasts point to an increase in meat production and the meat supply. That is literally a healthy sign.






