Something for Nothing?

Just how much we "kid" ourselves when we believe that a federal grant for some rublic improvement is getting something for nothing appears in this little table of figures that follows. It covers a recent period of tax payments to the government and receipt of grants from Washington.

That's according to the facts provided by the Iowa Republican state committee.

As far as that one period is concerned, the five states paid taxes in a sum eight and a half times as great as the grants received. With a cut in federal taxes, the five states might have carried their own public works and been many millions of dollars ahead.

Democratic spending of tax money loads the state with a far greater cost than the benefits received.

Some twenty years ago, there was national concern over the possibility that the growth of the chain stores might destroy independent, small-store merchandising. Now it can be determined—on the basis of facts, not guesses—just how the independents have fared in competition with the chains.

In 1929 the chains accounted for 21.2 per cent of all retail sales. In 1935 the figure was 24.5 per cent. In 1939 it was 22.7 per cent. And in 1948 it was down to 21.4 per cent.

These figures are easily interpreted. In that 20-year period, the total volume of retail business increased from \$49,00,000,000,000 a year. But the chains' proportion is almost the same as it was in 1929 when fear for the survival of the independent merchant was reaching a high-peak.

Hindsight is easy and foresight is difficult. But it appears, now, that we did the independent merchant an injustice when we were afraid that chain competition would be too much for him. What actually happened was that the independent took a good look at chain methods, adopted those which suited them, and added consumeratracting innovations of their own. They held their trade, and, as business increased, they got their share of it.

Here is a case where free competition has worked for the welfare of all concerned—producer; consumer, the chains and the independents too.

If most of us weren't well pleased with ourselves we'd do something about it.
