### Another Saving Plan, but.

We ran across an article in the June Atlantic magazine that serves to illustrate a point referred to in editorials in The Herald during the past few weeks.

Sumher H. Slichter, a noted Harvard economist, is the author of the article called "Our Best Defense." It discusses some of the problems that confront this country today—notably the "cold war," which he believes—will continue indefinitely, and which may cause our military expenditures to double by 1960.

In one section he writes: "There are

In one section he writes: "There are three major trends that must be halted or substantially retarded during the next decade if the economy is not to be basically transformed or if it is not to be confronted with grave new problems. These trends are the rapid rise in government expenditures, the rapid spread of government intervention in business, and the drop in the influence of businessmen in the community."

Dr. Slichter points out that in the last 200

Dr. Slichter points out that in the last 20 years Federal spending has increased 13-old while the dollar value of the output of the nation has increased only about 2.5

mes suggests a number of specific ways oreduce government expenditures. One to cut the amounts now being spent to old up the prices of farm products. Anter is to reduce the spending for trade thou feducation for veterans—in many asses, as he observes, the schools and the ourses involved are of scant educational alue.

Dr. Slichter's second expenditure-re-

Dr. Slichter's second expenditure-reduction plan may meet some opposition in Nebraska from former Glx and others interested in the agricultural courses being established for fowner Gls under the Bill of Rights.

Under this plan, just recently organized for this year, farmers may take agricultural courses offered at the 365 designated public schools in the state, just as other Gls have gone to colleges and trade schools.

Last year only 95 schools had facilities for this program. An additional 270 schools means a greater coverage ... and a greater expense.

Of the second major trend, government intervention in business, Dr. Slichter says that not all of the regulations, that have come into being in relatively recent years are bad. But he adds, "If the spread of government intervention in economics activities continues during the next decade as rapidly as in the last 20 years, the year 1960 will see the United States a far more completely regulated economy than it is today. Can this spread be substantially retarded?"

Dr. Slichter seems to think it can, though here he is none too sure. In this connection, he urges that private enterprise be as vigorous as possible. He also says, "If employers and trade unions were to agree on basic rules to govern industrial relations, a considerable withdrawal of government from that field might occur."

Finally, he believes it highly important that businessmen regain some of the

Finally, he believes it highly important that businessmen regain some of the influence which they have lost. For businessmen, he writes, "see many problems or aspects of problems that other groups do not see. Hence, they help produce better-balanced and better-informed public policies."


