#### Baseball Swan Song?

According to the schedule, Sunday night's game between Cakland and Wayne was to have been the last this season. Apparently no one cares much—except those who have undertaken to supervise the hard-ball program—and their only feeling is one of relief.

Latest information, a week ago, was that one club in the north half of our Pioneer league had already ceased operations. Another is begging out of final games whenever possible. Most have been forced to make extra drives for funds. In short, the operation has been anything and some teams dre about to expire, "sans regrets."

But as winter snows obliterate torn diamonds and appainted bleachers under a bed of white, the chilly season will also crase these currently apparent truths about our baseball league. Spring's promise will again fill-the, baseball heart and Pioneer league officials will again gather at Frement to lay plans for the "piggest season in history."

mont to lay plans for the "biggest season in history."

Teams which failed to fulfill their 1950 obligations will be back in the front seat, self-assured that they now know the answer, and that they now it be different."

But there is something wrong with the Floneer league. Don't oversimplify and think the answer is easy. because it is not. We should begin by admitting that baseball is America's national pastime; that thousands of Nebraskans love the sport. Admit too, that baseball is good for the kids, and therefore good for our communities. Logicialso makes us admit that most anything that is valuable is usually expensive—and we get what we pay for. Further, don't get the idea that the fault lies entirely with our local supervisors and committees. Nowhere can you find more unself-sh workers than we have had in our program.

And this point stands out—our club is in much better shape right now than most or possibly any in the league.

Don't say that an all-powerful winning team is a requisite to financial success. For in this league, the top teams are at the moment in the same boat with the softer touches. Weather this summer has been bad, but most tleams are no worse off this year than usual.

year than usual We appreciate what our local enthusiants have done for baseball. But something is wrong, so we make one suggestion. In any business operation where there is a free, competitive market, a man is paid from receipts according to what he is worth and according to what he employer can afford to play. Why shouldn't this apply to Pioneer league baseball—for all clubs, without exception?

It is player cost that causes the defi-

Unfortunately, there is no way of defi-nitely regulating the other team's player expense.

nitely regulating the other team.
The fan who supports baseball with his patronage should answer several questions and make his answers known: How much are you willing to pay for baseball in Wayne? What class of baseball do you want? Would you sacrifice a higher type of baseball to see local kids in action? Will you continue support whether your team is winning or losing?

you continue support whether your team is winning or losing?
This idea of running our baseball teams with a caviar appetite and a spaghetti income is obvious nonsense. We must find a way to make our clubs pay their way in the P. N. L., or seek a lower level of baseball entertainment.

## And Still No Fires ...





# IMPORTANT TO NEBRASKA ITS STATE AND COUNTY FAIRS

In June, 1868, when Indian skirmishes were still common, and just a little over a year after Nebraska had been admitted to the Union, the State Board of Agriculture met "to take into consideration the propriety of holding a fair." At this meeting it was decided that such an exposition should take place, and in July the board met once again to choose a location and the dates on which it would be held. Invitations were received from two cities, each offering special inducements that were considered by the board. After deliberation it was finally decided that this first fair would be held in Nebraska City on October 7th, 8th and 9th. A report of the fair proceedings to the legislature assembly listed winders for 12 of the 14 classes considered at that first fair. Included in the classes listed were: agricultural implements (sorgho evaporator), cultivator (riding), cultivator (walking). Balley's patented clothes wringer, churn, and farm gate. One of the classes mentioned in the report, and listed as 'discretionary,' 'included, lot grape vines, instant relief, flavorther extracts, patent hen's nest, model soop, bee hives, stand of bees, specimen of mineral, case of preserved butterflies, wild plums, tame plums, cluster of grapes, and variety of pears. Mayor H. T. Brooks of fearl Creek, New York, was the fair's principal speaker. At the end of this first state-wide festive event, Nebraskans said goodbye to many new friends... pioneers all ... and returned home with determination to put into practice the things they had learned.

In the year 1898 the State Legislature established the permanent site of the fair at Lincoln. In that year, due to financial difficulties, the Fair Board found it impossible to hold a fair. Since then, however, the



The attendance at the 1949 Nebraska State Fair was approximately 225,000 people. During Fair Week a seven-bed emergency hospital is maintained. Nebraska was the first state to inaugurate the hospital unit at state fairs. In 1849 over 600 baby beeves and over 300 dairy calves were shown. In one of the outstanding swine shows in the nation there were enough hose on exhibit to feed 10,000 people for one year. Total premiums in the open class livestock divisions at the 1949 fair amounted to \$37,173. Premiums offered in each class were: Swine, \$9,807; Horses, \$5,418; Beef Cattle, \$11,654; Dairy Cattle, \$6,351; Sheep, \$2,443; and Poultry, \$1,500.

Here, Nebraska youths are given the opportunity to exhibit the products they have made or raised during the year in their club work... here are provided appropriate show windows for these outstanding rural educational movements.

As Nebraskans in all parts of the state are once again preparing for their State and County Fairs, excitement and anticipation is in the air. Contestants, whether they win or lose, will be vicher in experience and knowledge. Those who attend only to "see the sights" will enjoy the many exhibits emphasizing the tremendous value and importance of the resources of their great state. All will return home convinced, more than ever, that there is no place like Nebraska . . . a great state in which to live, work, and raise our families.


