





### A Vote Costs You \$1.35

A Vote Costs You \$1.35

Governor Val. Peterson, republican candidate for reelection, is worth at least \$1,277.10 to Wayne county. It cost county taxpayers \$1,35 for each of the 946 votes cast for Peterson in the August 9 primary election cost the county \$2,106.71 in fixed costs, to say nothing of the time and effort spent by county officials in pre-primary preparations. There were 1,560 ballots cast in the election, and that averages out to a cost of \$1.35 per ballot.

Whether you're all-out for economy in government, an efficiently expert or just a plain citizen, figures like that could mean one of two things. Either more people should recognize their civid duty and vote—they're paying for the phylicage anyway functions of government.

Very few would support the latter. It is up to the majority who want to see local governments continue to function to vote. If all the approximately 3,000 registered voters in the county would have been only 70 cents.

The state law requires the county to spend money for specified items and services during an election. A breakdown of the \$2,106.71 follows: salaries for election officials, \$1,083.05; ballots and supplies, \$876.36; newspaper publication of notices, \$133.45; and rent for polling places, stamps and other miscellaneous supplies, \$13.85.

According to the ballot returns, Hans etgen is the most valuable candidate. he 1,178 votes for him are worth \$1,-0.30 to county taxpayers.







Nebraska taxpayers have invested a total of approximately \$1,000,000 during the past 50 years for crop research, but at present prices the increased return is estimated at \$90,000,000 each year.

In 1949, 3,761,000 acres of wheat were harvested with an approximate total production of 54,408,000 bushels. The appropriate total value of the 1949 wheat crop was \$103,375,000. Four whose varieties, Pawnee, Nebred, Cheyenne and Turkey, made up 93% of the state's wheat acreage. Over 98% of the acreage was planted in winter wheat while less than 2% was made up of spring wheat. Records prove that now shipments of smutty wheat originating in the state have been reduced to approximately one-half of one percent of the total receipts. Acre yields have also been increased. This great improvement in the quality of Nebraska wheat has also resulted in better market acceptance. Once frowned upon, Nebraska wheat is now favorably known at principal terminal markets, and is purchased by discriminating buyers at prevailing or premium prices.






