A comparative newcomer in the industrial picture of Ne braska, the Trucking Industry has enjoyed rapid growth and expansion in the past twenty years. Today the motor carrier industry ranks second only to agriculture in size and import-

This gigantic This gigantic operation is a state industry of which Ne-braskans can well be proud. Playing an important part in the state's vital distribution program, the contributions the industry has made to the welfare and prosperity of Nebraska are many.
