



People's Confidence

The Eisenhower's recommendations to congress and the American people that we take part in European defenses are a blow to those who had hoped we might escape that responsibility and concentrate on building our forces here at home. Members of both political parties have been guilty of impetuous statements and actions that have lowered their presenting at a time when they are expected to make important decisions affecting the country's future. The present drop in enrollment at the various state teachers colleges should make us pause and examine what the present defense effort is doing to our educational system. The effect of the teacher shortage is already being felt in our schools, and educational standards are sure to be lowered as fewer qualified teachers are available in the future.

In her race to build a mighty military force, Soviet Russia has not overlooked the value of education. This is shown by the fact that Russian youths, up for military service at 18 years, may be exempted in order to finish their schooling. We fiten think of the average Russian as being uneducated, but the Russians are placing, a steadily higher value on education; and their long-range plans may be more farsighted than our own in this respect. It remains for us to solve the teacher problem by encouraging and supporting the training of more teachers in our state schools. Since most of our future teachers will be women, with the services in need of a greater number of males, it is our problem to make it easier for girls to attend co lege. It is not easy to support more spending for education when the defense effort is demanding more and more taxation. But our country's future depends upon high educational standards if we are to remain strong. We must not overlook the long-range problems in our efforts to solve the immediate ones.

At the meeting of the Nebraska Legislature, now in session, there is again the matter of a proposed sales tax to come hefore that group. A bill considering a sales tax has been presented several times before. LB-296 sponsored this year is comparable to others but includes exemption for items under 21 cents and food.

What about a sales tax? Do the people of the state or this community believe that such a tax? Let us check the pros and cons of a sales tax.

First, a sales tax is definitely capable of raising revenue. Secondly, it can do so without being paid in a lump sum at the first of the year, as our other taxes are paid. Third, it is a tax that is reasonably easy and economical to administer.

On the other side of the story, a sales tax is not a fair tax since it has a standard rate that is paid by both the wealthy and the poor. It is a nuisance tax, creating considerable handling of small change and tokens. If a sales tax is passed it will probably be an additional tax. Also, Nebraska prides herself on the absence of such a tax. In this country it is the people who should help decide the important issues before the legislative body. It is your right and duty to inform your state representative about your opinions concerning the sales tax.

There should be definite assurances made that a statewide sales tax will bring about some reduction in present property taxes. Let us beware of the lawmaker probbby group who is or will be suggesting new ways to spend increased tax income."
