





But Korea and the Chinese Reds have not yet aroused the British lion to the degrate of ferocity he is now showing because of the Iranian upheavals.

This is oil—and British investments—at stake in Iran, not in Korea. It all depends upon whose ox is gored. It isn't the principle of the thing—it's the money!
