What this amounts to is that, so far as price control is concerned, we have government without representation of the government without representation of the government. There are more than 3,000,000 retail outlets in this country—Wayne and the surrounding communities house a small part of this number. They are all kinds and sizes, from the biggest chain to the smallest one-man shop. They sell every conceivable commodity. Their operators—it may be your neighbor of the fellow across the street—come in direct daily contact with you and us—the consumers as a whole. The whole success of the price control effort depends on their cooperation—and upon their understanding of what must be done. Finally, they are the ones who can tell OPS and any other interested agency what is feasible in the way of regulations and what is not.

It seems inconceivable that the retailers have no official method of making their problems known to price control officials. Unless the retailers can and do obey the
