At the recent press meeting in Wayne Governor Peterson expressed alarm at the great amount of sensationalism which dominates daily newspapers and radio. According to the governor there should be more emphasis placed on news of an educational nature including adequate background to the news. The reporter on a daily newspaper should be one of the best informed persons in the community, he said.

The editor of a drily newspaper is faced with the problem of supplying his reporters with the kind of news they want and demand. If stories of accidents, sex and crime carry the largest reader interest the editor must publish this kind of news or suffer loss in circulation. If sensationalism dominates the news it is because most Americans prefer to be entertained than enlightened. The


