# Wonder Drugs

It is probably correct to say that medical science has made greater strides in the development of new drugs in the past two decades than in the entire history of medicine. New wonder drugs are now used not only to relieve pair and distress, but also to remove the cause of disease.

The history of the wonder drugs began back in 1932 with the discovery of the sulpha drugs. Now the list of wonder drugs includes in addition to the sulphas, penicillin, streptomycin, aureomycin, chloromycetin, terramycin, bacitracin, neomycin, atabrine, pentaquin, chloroquin, paludrin, and the hormone, cortisone.

One out of every four persons stricken with pneumonia died 20 years ago, but to-day most victims are healed with penicillin in three or four days. With the development of isonicotinic acide hydrazide, some tuberculosis victims have literally been pulled back from the brink of the grave.

But even considering the great advances that medical science has made in the past few years, the challenge of finding drugs and serums that will combat other major diseases, such as cancer, which kills about 200,000 people each year, still faces those who are writing medical history.

Wonder drugs for the treatment of the common cold, high blood pressure, hardening of the arteries, infantile paralysis, and others are still needed.




