We endeavor to carry a complete stock of parts for MACHINERY we sell dur customers, but we do not carry parts for our CUSTOMERS.

Every year during corn picking season, many men lose an arm, hand or leg while operating a corn picker. We cannot replace these, nor can anyone else. Ninetynine out of a hundred of these accidents could have been prevented had the operator taken just a few seconds more time to shut off the machine before he attempted to make any adjustments. The time saved by not obeying the simple rules of safety proves very costly in human life, and we do not think it is worth the chance.

This year when you operate your corn picker, make a promise to yourself that you will leave all shields in place, that you will never make any adjustments or do any greasing unless the machine is out of gear. If someone is on the tractor when you do attempt to make an adjustment, make sure that he will not put the machine in motion while your hands are near moving parts.

f this message saves only a minor accident this year, we will be very happy and consider the time and effort worthwhile.




