We have finally reached the point where the cost of government is so huge that even the confiscatory taxes paid by people in the high-income groups hardly make a dent in the total—and the people of small and moderate means must carry the bulk of the burden.

Early in 1951, Secretary of the Treasury Snyder presented some revealing facts to a House committee. They concerned the distribution of surtax net income — which is the income left after deductions for personal exemptions and dependents.

If we expropriated every nickel of income the rich have, the resulting revenue would carry the government for only a matter of weeks. It's the "small man" who must pay — as tens of millions learned last March 15. And it's the "small man" who has the most to gain from efficient, economical government, and reduced taxes.
