Postoffice Sets New Mail Record

Last Monday is believed to be the heaviest day for incoming mail in the history of the Wayne postoffice.

An estimated 1,000 parcels and 12,000 letters and cards were handled during the day.

Fifteen trips by two parcel post trucks and two men working on each city route were necessary to process all the mail.

Rural Schools Hold Programs

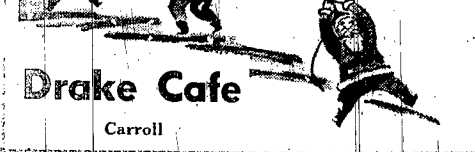

Wayne State's game with Southern Teachers, Springfield, S.D. was the last basketball contest for the local fans until after Christmas vacation.

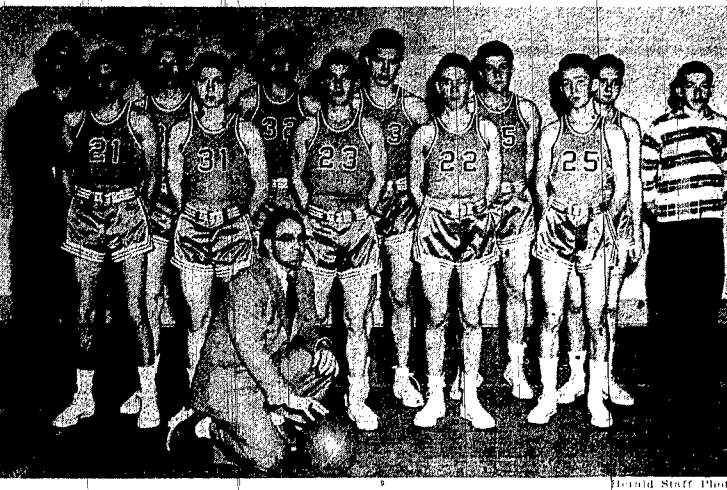

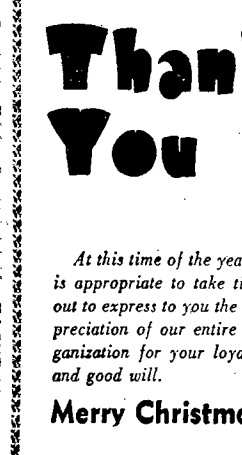
All of the buildings on the farm have been painted since the aerial photo was taken. Asphalt shingles have been put on the barn, house
